USPA NEWS - Austin-Texas, 13 January 2016 - EnergyNet to host the 2nd Powering Africa Summit (PAS) at the Marriott Marquis, Washington, D.C. from 27-29th January 2016. African Development Bank President and World Bank President will give the opening statements at the summit.

The summit will make in-depth analyses of the US Government's Africa investment strategy into the energy sector and align these goals to the current opportunities for investment. EnergyNet focused solely on Africa's power sector and frontier market power generation for over 20 years, and they have had the privilege to witness the passion and long-term commitment it takes to "turn the lights on in Africa."
